Whereas, a public health emergency was declared for the United States, and a disaster declaration, due to public health emergency caused by the novel Coronavirus ("COVID-19") was declared for the State of Texas; and

Whereas, on March 19, 2020 the City of Burnet declared a disaster due to public health emergency, which has been extended by City Council and continues currently; and

Whereas, over 101 cases of COVID-19 existed in Burnet County as of June 22, 2020; and

Whereas, the City of Burnet continues to see an increase in COVID-19 cases at an exponential rate and has been advised by the Burnet County health officer that masks and social distancing are necessary to curb this increase and prevent Burnet County and the City of Burnet healthcare providers from becoming overwhelmed; and

Whereas, Governor's Order GA-26 impacting a local jurisdiction's authority under Chapter 418 of the Texas Government Code remains in effect at this time;

Now, therefore, be it proclaimed, that I, Crista Goble Bromley, Mayor of the City of Burnet on behalf of the City Council, of the City of Burnet, Texas, do hereby

ENCOURAGE ALL CITIZENS TO WEAR MASKS IN PUBLIC PLACES AND PRACTICE SOCIAL DISTANCING, AND HEREBY ENCOURAGE BUSINESSES AND PROFESSIONAL ORGANIZATIONS TO ASK THEIR EMPLOYEES, CUSTOMERS AND CLIENTS TO WEAR MASKS AND PRACTICE SOCIAL DISTANCING;

and I do hereby encourage all citizens and businesses and professional organizations to actively adhere to CDC guidelines and the recommendations of the Burnet County Health Authority regarding COVID-19. The City of Burnet will continue to provide masks to the public and to City businesses to the extent the City has masks available in order to assist with this effort. Businesses are encouraged to adopt policies requiring all customers and employees to wear masks while inside the business, to provide for social distancing while shopping, to encourage contactless delivery methods for products and services whenever possible, to take temperatures of employees and/or customers when appropriate, and to promote working from home by employees that have the capability to do so. CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by Mayor Bromley, at 6:03 p.m.

<u>ROLL CALL</u>: City Secretary Kelly Dix called the roll. Mayor Bromley was present in Chambers. Council Member Shanes, Farmer, Talamantez, Lester, Clinton and Thurman called in on the zoom conference. Quorum was established. <u>CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS</u>:

Approval of the June 9th, 2020 Special City Council Meeting minutes

Council Member Cindia Talamantez moved to approve the consent agenda as presented. Council Member Mary Jane Shanes seconded. City Secretary Kelly Dix called a roll vote. Council Members Lester, Thurman, Shanes, Clinton, Farmer, Talamantez and Mayor Bromley all voted in favor. The motion carried unanimously. PUBLIC HEARINGS: None.

ACTION ITEMS:

Discuss and consider action: Direction to staff and authorization for the City Manager to execute processes/plans due to the COVID-19 response: D. Vaughn: No action taken.

Fire Chief Mark Ingram reported:

- Chief Ingram stated that the number of cases to date is one hundred and one for Burnet County and about one third of the cases are still active.
- There have been three deaths in Burnet County to due COVID-19.
- Corona Virus testing continues at the Fairgrounds.
- Two hundred and ninety-seven antibody tests have been conducted at the Fire Station to date.
- Currently area hospitals are at approximately sixty-eight percent of occupancy.

City Manager David Vaughn reported:

- The City Manager informed all present that the Mighty Thomas Carnival has gone well. Chief Ingram confirmed that they were in compliance with state protocols throughout the event.
- The City Manager discussed businesses and mask requirements due to the increase in cases. Council requested a proclamation be added to the next agenda encouraging mask usage by all citizens.
- Director of Finance Patricia Langford reviewed the May Financial Report, to include revenues and expenses for each fund. Council Member Thurman requested the allocation page to be enhanced to show a clearer picture of each allocation.
- Mr. Vaughn informed all present that items would be prepared for the commercial and residential utility assistance programs for the next agenda.

Discuss and consider action: The School Resource Officer (SRO) Interlocal Agreement with Burnet Consolidated Independent School District: D. Vaughn: Council Member Paul Farmer made a motion to approve and authorize the City Manager to execute the School Resource Officer Interlocal agreement with Burnet Consolidated Independent School District as presented. Council Member Mary Jane Shanes seconded. City Secretary Kelly Dix called a roll vote. Council Members Lester, Thurman, Shanes, Clinton, Farmer, Talamantez and Mayor Bromley all voted in favor. The motion carried unanimously.

Vaughn

Background: On June 9, 2020 City Council responded to the financial devastation caused to residents experiencing financial hardship caused by the COVID-19 pandemic by establishing the Residential Customer Utility Payment Assistance Program. The program provides eligible applicants with assistance equaling 50% of the applicant's utility bills for the months of April and May. The program closure date is June 30, 2020. This amendment would extend the closure date and allow staff to continue to receive applications for April and May assistance until July 10, 2020 and release grants if an approved applicant pays their 50% contribution on or before July 20, 2020.

Moreover, this amendment authorizes the City Manager to accept a donation of \$10,000.00 from the Salvation Army. The purpose of this donation is to extend the program to include the June billing. In addition to the Salvation Army donation the City shall fund \$15,000, to the June billing cycle component of the Program. Applications for June assistance will be accepted until July 31, 2020 and approved grants shall be credited to the utility bills, up to \$250.00, for applicants who pay their 50% contribution on or before August 10, 2020. Applicants who received the maximum \$250.00 grant for the April/May billing cycle would be eligible to up to a \$250.00 grant for the June billing cycle.

| Information: | All other provisions of the Residential Customer Utility Payment Assistance Program shall remain the same. Customers who have had more than two service disconnects for non-payment from March 2019 to February 2020 shall be ineligible to participate in the program. |

RESOLUTION 2020-27

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BURNET, TEXAS AMENDING THE RESIDENTIAL UTILITY CUSTOMER PAYMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM AUTHORIZING UTILITY PAYMENT ASSISTANCE TO RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS EXPERIENCING FINANCIAL HARDSHIP DUE TO THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC.

WHEREAS, on June 7th 2020, City Council established the Residential Utility Customer Payment Assistance Program to provide a grant of 50% of the utility bill amounts for the months of April and May of this year for residential customers significantly adversely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the program was set to expire on June 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, City Council deems it in the public interest and necessity to extend the expiration date for submission of applications for assistance on the April and May bill and the expiration date for eligible customers payment of their portion of their utility bill; and

WHEREAS, the Salvation Army has offered to donate \$10,000.00 to extend the Residential Utility Customer Payment Assistance Program to provide payment assistance with eligible customer's June utility bills; and

WHEREAS, City Council deems it appropriate to add an additional \$15,000.00, from the LCRA refund, to the Salvation's Army's contribution to provide for up to \$25,000.00 Residential Utility Customer Payment Assistance Program to provide payment assistance for the month of June.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BURNET, TEXAS:

<u>Section one. Findings.</u> The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this Resolution for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the City Council.

<u>Section two. Section (3) program amendment.</u> The Residential Customers Public Utility Payment Assistance Program Guidelines are hereby amended by amending Section (3) thereof, in its entirety, to read as follows:

(3) <u>Funding.</u> Grants made under this Program shall be made from an LCRA refund that was deposited in the Electric Fund this fiscal year and a donation from the Salvation Army and shall be distributed as follows:

- (a) April and May Billing Cycle. Grants made under this component of the Program shall be made from an LCRA refund that was deposited in the Electric Fund this fiscal year. The maximum municipal expenditure under this component of the Program shall be \$25,000.00 for the April and May billing. Applications shall be administered on a first come first serve basis and the Program shall end when the maximum fund amount is expended or on July 20, 2020, whichever occurs first. Applications shall continue to be accepted until July 10, 2020; however, a grant authorized under this Program shall expire should the applicant fail to pay their 50% contribution to their utility bill on or before July 20, 2020.
- (b) June Billing Cycle. Grants under this subsection (b) are predicated on receipt of a grant from the Salvation Army. The maximum municipal expenditure under this component of the Program shall be the total amount of the Salvation Army grant plus \$15,000.00 that shall come from the LCRA refund. Applications shall be administered on a first come first serve basis and this component of the Program shall end when the maximum fund amount is expended or on July 31, 2020, whichever occurs first. Applications received on or before July 31, 2020 shall be eligible for grant consideration provided applicants pay their 50% contribution to their utility bill on or before August 10, 2020.

<u>Section three.</u> Section (4) program amendment. The Residential Customers Public Utility Payment Assistance Program Guidelines are hereby amended by amending Section (3) thereof, in its entirety, to read as follows:

(4) Program Term.

(a) <u>Program Term.</u> The Program shall be instituted for the April and May 2020 utility billing cycles. Upon on receipt of a grant from the Salvation Army the Program term shall be extended to include the June 2020 utility billing cycle.

<u>Section four. Section (7) program amendment.</u> The Residential Customers Public Utility Payment Assistance Program Guidelines are hereby amended by amending Section (7) thereof, in its entirety, to read as follows:

(7) <u>Maximum Grant Amount.</u> Grants shall be in the form of a credit of 50% of a recipient's electric, water, sewer, garbage and recycling services charges incurred on their City of Burnet Utility Account during the Program Term, not to exceed \$250.00 total for any residential utility customer for the April/May program period and

\$250.00 total for any residential utility customer for the June program period.

Section five. Unamended terms. Except as expressly amended by this resolution, all terms and conditions of the Residential Customers Public Utility Payment Assistance Program Guidelines established by Resolution No. R2020-23, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section six. Authorization. The City Manager is authorized to manage all aspects of the Program; and, is authorized and directed to take those actions that are reasonably necessary to facilitate the purpose of this Resolution, including but not limited to accepting the Salvation Army donation.

<u>Section seven. Severability.</u> The sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Resolution are severable and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section should be declared invalid by the final judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections that can be given effect without the invalid provision, and to this end the provisions are severable.

Section eight. Notice. This Resolution shall be given prompt and general publicity.

<u>Section nine. Effective date</u>. This Resolution shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance.

Background: On May 26, 2020 City Council responded to the financial devastation caused to businesses experiencing financial hardship caused by the COVID-19 pandemic by establishing the Commercial Customer Utility Payment Assistance The program provides eligible applicants with Program. assistance equaling 50% of the applicant's utility bills for the month May. This amendment would expand the program to include assistance with the June utility bill. Recipients of assistance for the May utility bill would be allowed to request assistance for the June utility bill. Commercial utility customers who did not receive assistance with their May utility bills may apply for assistance with their June utility bills; however they may not retroactively request assistance for their May utility bill

An amendment to the program is proposed as follows:

(4) Program term. The program shall be instituted for a twomonth period beginning in May of 2020 and ending on June 30, 2020. Acceptance of applications for assistance for the May utility bills is closed on June 30, 2020. A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF BURNET AMENDING AN ECONOMIC STIMULUS PROGRAM PROVIDING COMMERCIAL CUSTOMERS PUBLIC UTILITY PAYMENT ASSISTANCE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article III, Section 52-a of the Texas Constitution and Chapter 380 of the Texas Local Government Code City Council established a program to provide public utility payment assistance to commercial customers; and

WHEREAS, certain local businesses are still experiencing significant revenue loss and/or cost increases due to the COVIT-19 pandemic and the governor's shelter in place orders; and

WHEREAS, City Council desires to extend the adopted program to stimulate business and commercial activity within the city limits by providing struggling businesses with utility payment assistance.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BURNET, TEXAS, THAT:

Section one. Findings. The foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted by the City Council and made a part hereof for all purposes as findings of fact.

<u>Section two.</u> Program amended. The Commercial Customers Public Utility Payment Assistance Program is hereby amended by amending Section (4) in its entirety to read as follows:

(5) Program term. The program shall be instituted for a twomonth period beginning in May of 2020 and ending on June 30, 2020. Acceptance of applications for assistance for the May utility bills is closed on June 30, 2020. However, any commercial customer significantly adversely financially impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic may submit an application for Public Utility Payment Assistance for the June billing cycle; provided the application is received and payment of the customer's 50% portion of their utility bill is received on or before July 31, 2020.

All other terms and conditions of the Commercial Customers Public Utility Payment Assistance Program established by Resolution No. R2020-18, shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>Section three.</u> Authorization. The City Manager is authorized to manage all aspects of the program; and, is authorized and directed to take those actions that are reasonably necessary to facilitate the purpose of this Resolution.

<u>Section four. Open Meetings.</u> It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this resolution was passed was open to the public and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, as modified by the governor's orders in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

<u>Section five. Effective Date.</u> This resolution shall take effect upon approval and adoption by City Council.
