<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: The meeting was called to order by Mayor Gary Wideman, at 6:30 p.m.

PUBLIC RECOGNITION/SPECIAL REPORTS:

<u>Proclamation for Native Plant Week: Native Plant Society of Texas:</u> Mayor Gary Wideman presented the proclamation declaring Native Plant Week. Fred Zagst, representing the Native Plant Society of Texas accepted the proclamation and invited all present to attend the National Plant Week Celebration to be held at the Hatchery on October 5, 2013.

<u>Chamber of Commerce Report:</u> Deborah Page informed Council that David Bennett, and Michelle Devaney were both re-elected to serve another term on the Chamber of Commerce Board and Daniel Scarborough and Kathy Snider were elected to serve first terms. Ms. Page reported that Kid's Day Out was a huge success and that 1,068 pounds of food was collected for La Care. Upcoming events are the Burnet County Barbeque Cook Off, Day Out with Thomas, and the Homecoming Pep Rally to be held on the square. Christmas on the square is in full swing and the 2014 Bluebonnet Festival preparations are already starting.

<u>Airport Board Report:</u> Ken Wittikiend presented the Airport Board report and briefed Council on various projects that the board is working on.

No opposing votes. The motion carried with a vote of 7 in favor and 0 opposed.

Ingram:</u> Council Member Paul Shell made a motion to approve the Emergency Medical Services contract with Burnet County as presented. Council Member Milton Phair seconded, the motion carried unanimously. <u>Discuss and consider action: EMS Billing and Credit Reporting: M. Ingram:</u> Council Member Philip Thurman made a motion to authorize staff to proceed with collection of outstanding debt for Emergency Medical Services billing and to proceed with credit reporting. Council Member Paul Shell seconded the motion carried unanimously.

Nelson:</u> Council Member Paul Shell made a motion to approve the County Dispatching Fees and Radio Maintenance Agreement as presented. <u>Discuss and consider action: Implementation of Stage Two Drought Contingency Measures: D. Vaughn:</u> Council Member Milton Phair made a motion to implement State Two Drought Contingency Measures for the City of Burnet. Council Member Paul Shell seconded, the motion carried unanimously.

Addendum to the City Council Agenda: Department and Committee Reports/Briefings: The City Council may or may not receive a briefing dependent upon activity or change in status regarding the matter. <u>Project Update Report: L. Figueroa:</u> Ms. Figueroa explained to Council the new procedure being used for crack repair on the wastewater tank. Ms. Figueroa reported that the contractor has had more crew on site and is catching up on the schedule. Pricing is currently being obtained for interior seal on the tank walls and will be presented to Council at a later date.

<u>Fire Department Project Update: M. Ingram:</u> Chief Ingram briefed the Council on the current status of the new fire station facility to include a review of the current timeline and progress. Currently the project is running about two weeks behind. The wiring issue has been rectified, the rafters will be installed in the next week and the current completion date is looking like the end of January 2014. Chief Ingram stated that Teal Construction and the City Building Official are monitoring progress closely.

<u>August 2013 Financial Report: D. Vaughn:</u> City Manager David Vaughn reviewed the fund balances and current debt and cash asset with the Council and reported that the fiscal outlook for the City through August was very good.

<u>REQUESTS FROM COUNCIL FOR FUTURE REPORTS:</u> City Manager David Vaughn reported that staff would be providing a monthly update report on all projects ongoing in the City as requested by Council.
