<u>Burnet Fire Department Life Saving Awards:</u> Fire Chief Mark Ingram recognized Hannah Smith, Vanessa Escamilla and Brailey Hall for saving the life of five year old Jordan Johnson on September 6th, 2014 with the presentation of a certificate and Chief's coin for their heroic act. Mayor Gary Wideman presented each young lady with an angel charm bracelet on behalf of the City Council and expressed his praise and admiration for each.

<u>Chamber of Commerce Report; Damon Beierle:</u> Mr. Beierle informed Council that the turn out for Kids Day Out was great and enjoyed by many. The Burnet County Barbecue Cook Off is this weekend and the committee is still looking for judges if anyone is interested.
